Is tutoring the future of education?

The tide is turning on traditional education, and tutoring is emerging from the shadows as a powerful tool for student success. No longer viewed with scepticism as 'shadow-schooling', tutoring is rapidly becoming a mainstream approach to learning. Students, and parents on their behalf, are increasingly seeking the support of tutors at some point in their learning journey. A recent study found that 30% of all 11-16-year-olds in England and Wales (rising to 46% in London) have received private tuition.¹ In response to this growing demand, the UK government has recently doubled its funding for the National Tutoring Programme, which was originally rolled-out in 2020.2

At a time when teacher retention and pupil attendance are at an all-time low, tutoring offers a gentler, more person-centred and holistic approach to teaching and learning. It provides one-to-one or small group teaching sessions, which are tailored to each student's unique needs and learning style. The benefits of tutoring for students are undeniable. By providing personalised guidance and support, tutors can boost students' confidence, nurture a long-term love for learning and help them achieve their full academic potential.

Once considered a Plan B option, tutoring is fast becoming a legitimate career choice. In increasing numbers, burnt-out and disillusioned teachers are leaving their profession to pursue tutoring full-time, which allows for a better work-life balance and the opportunity to personalise their teaching. Students and recent graduates are also taking up tutoring in large numbers, attracted by its flexible working hours and opportunity for career progression. It is becoming apparent therefore, that tutoring is here to stay as a viable and important profession. But for tutoring to become part of mainstream education, and become an accessible option for all our students, we need more, and better qualified, tutors.

Julia Silver is a former school leader and seasoned tutor with first-hand experience of the challenges that come with tutoring. During her many years in the field, Julia noticed how lonely, unregulated and unsupportive the world of tutoring could be, which drove her to advocate for significant change. In 2019 she founded Qualified Tutor, a professional development community that certifies, develops and supports tutors.
